

Suggested format for the thesis

Regarding the formal implementation of theses, we recommend taking the formal requirements of the thesis/diploma thesis as a basis. Consideration of the following aspects is also one of the aspects of scoring the thesis.

The paper must be prepared with a computer text editor and printed on white A/4 sheets. Leave a margin of 3 cm on the left side of the page and 2.5 to 2.5 cm on the other sides.

With regard to the structure of the paragraphs and the font used, you can choose from the following two versions, but the selected style must be used uniformly for the thesis as a whole:

- 1st style variant (French-style paragraph): The text of the paragraphs begins with an indentation; the lines must be separated. Paragraphs follow each other without skipping a line. The font of the text is Times New Roman 12 point. Line spacing is 1.5, letter spacing is 0 (without narrowing or thinning).
- 2nd style variant (Anglo-Saxon type paragraph): The paragraph starts with the first character of the first line, there is a series of gaps between the paragraphs. The font of the text is Arial CE 11 point. Line spacing is 1.5, letter spacing is 0 (without narrowing or thinning).

Pagination begins with the first page of the Introduction following the Table of Contents. The table of contents does not have page numbers, and if it is several pages long, it must be numbered in Roman numerals.

Highlight chapter titles in capital letters, bold and/or italics. Individual chapters and subsections must be arranged in a decimal hierarchy. The font size and style of the chapter headings must be adapted to the hierarchy and applied consistently and uniformly throughout the thesis.

In order to highlight ideas, first of all, correct wording should be used, if this is unavoidable, use italics.

Tables and figures in the text can be at most A4 size, those larger than this must be placed as attachments on the back of the cover page in a bag for this purpose or folded to A4 size and bound. All figures, tables and annexes must be numbered and titled, below the figure and above the table. If the figure or table was adopted by the author from a foreign source, the source must be cited under the figure or table (in the case of a converted figure in the form "following X. Y. [year]") and must be indicated in the bibliography.

The photographs published in the thesis are also considered illustrations. In accordance with technical photography, a scale must be indicated on the photographs (with the exception of landscape images).

The appendices form a separate chapter on the consecutively numbered pages following the text, so they must also be listed in the table of contents.

All quantities must be entered only with their unit of measure so that the accuracy of the results is consistent with that of the data.

The variables of quantities included in mathematical formulas must always be interpreted directly after the formula, if there is no list of abbreviations and variables at the beginning of the thesis. Use a mark for only one variable throughout the entire text.

Among the formulas, only those that are referred to in the text should be numbered.

Since the thesis is considered a scientific or engineering work, it is an important requirement to present the sources and works used in the text at the place of reference, and to list them in the bibliography.

In the appropriate place in the text, according to the usual method in the scientific literature, the last name of the author(s) and the year of the source must be cited:

in the case of one author: (Hacsek, 2006)

two authors: (Hacsek and Sajó, 2006)

more than two authors: (Hacsek et al., 2006)

Only the works cited and/or referred to in the text, processed and accepted, may and must be included in the bibliography, in alphabetical order according to the name of the first author. The existence of the bibliography is a necessary formal condition for the acceptance of the thesis.

The first name/first names of the individual authors must be included after the last name, only with an initial letter (e.g. Kovács J. or Smith, J. P). In the case of several authors, the names of the individual authors are separated with a comma, but the last author's name is preceded by an "and" instead of a comma (e.g. Kovács J. and Szabó I. or Kovács J, Szabó I. and K. Nagy). The individual source types must be indicated in the following form:

1. Books: Name of author(s) (year of publication): Book title. (publisher, place of publication, time, year) page number. E.g.: Kovács J. (2002): Schrödinger and the cats. (Gondolat Publishing House, Budapest, 2002) 203-210. If there is no author or editor: Address. (publisher, place of publication, year) page number. E.g.: Hungarian statistical yearbook. (Statistics Publishing House, Budapest, 1993.) 25-33.

For an article published in a study volume, e.g.: Kovács J. (2003): Schrödinger and cats. In: L. Horváth (ed.) (2003): Modern physics. (Academic Publishing House, Buda-pest, 2003) 134-185.

2. Articles and studies published in journals: Name of author(s) (year of publication): Title of the study. The title of the journal. volume number, page number. E.g.: Árkai P. and Kovács S. (1986): Diagenesis and regional metamorphism of the Mesozoic of Aggtelek-Rudabánya mountains (NE Hungary). Acta Geol. Hung. 29, 349-373.
3. Other sources:
 - 3.1. Conference presentation: the exact title of the presentation, the name, place and time of the conference, the place and publisher of the publication and the page numbers in question. E.g. Pitelis, C.N. (1997): Productivity, competitiveness and convergence in the global economy: the role of the supply side. EUNIP "Practical Proposals for Industrial Policy in Europe". conference, Warwick, March 8-12, 1996. (multiplication)
 - 3.2. Internet journal: the exact name and access to the document in URL form (e.g. <http://www.bme.hu/>), as well as the date of the last update. E.g.: Molnár L.: Information or knowledge society? Some thoughts on knowledge and information. In: INCO 2000/01, <http://www.inco.hu/inco3/tudas/cikk1h.htm>, download date: 2006.08.10.
 - 3.3. From the Internet (not a magazine): (if possible) next to the title, the author, main title and date of download must also be provided.
